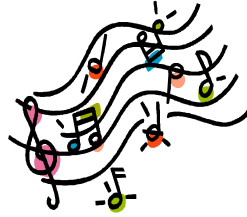

## ABORIGINAL DRUMMERS COME TO CAMILLA SCHOOL STUDENTS

Students from the Kipohtakaw (Alexander First Nation) Education Centre presented their native drumming skills to Camilla School students on Friday, February 12, 2010.

This visit preceded the **Drumming Course coming soon to Camilla School**. This course is optional and will likely be offered during noon recess. Students will have the opportunity to visit the Amiskwaciy Academy in Edmonton to see a drum presentation and to see how the drums are made. Amiskwaciy is Edmonton's first all native high school that has recently opened in Edmonton and accommodates 225 students.

Open to all male students in grades 7-9 this course introduces students to the First Nations culture and ways of drumming that have long influenced Western art forms. Students will learn the facts and philosophy surrounding the making and playing of the native drums. They will experience first hand the rich heritage of the First Nations culture and music. Students will discover the myths and stories which birthed the rituals of the drum and give meaning to the music. They will learn about the drum's history, the traditional ways of making a drum and the many meanings of the drum and rituals which symbolize traditional meanings. They will also have the opportunity to make their own drums. Students must have a keen interest in the native culture and belief system.

This Drumming Course is a pilot project here at Camilla School and has many dimensions. It is our hope that the program will develop to include rattle making and beading and will eventually include both male and female students. Scheduling information will be forthcoming. Please watch for more details as the program unfolds. Parents/guardians are invited to call Michael Byrne, Principal at Camilla School for more information.

# Winter sports safety

Make sure your children are safe when they toboggan and skate.

Children can strangle on a cord or scarf.

Use a neck warmer instead of a scarf.

**Take the cords and drawstrings off their clothes.**

## Safety Tips

- Keep children warm. Dress your children in layers. Make sure their heads and necks are covered by a hat and a neck warmer. Watch for frostbite!
- On sunny days, put sunscreen on their skin.
- Check your children's equipment to make sure that it fits and is in good condition.



### When tobogganing or sledding:

- Make sure your children wear a helmet.
- Choose a hill that is away from roads and parking lots. There should be no rocks, trees, fences or other dangers in the path.
- Teach your children to slide down the middle of the hill, climb up the side and watch up the hill.
- Teach them to move out of the way quickly when they get to the bottom.

### When skating:

- Children should wear a helmet.
- If you skate on lakes or rivers make sure the ice is smooth and at least 10 centimetres or 4 inches thick. **Never skate near open water.**
- Children should skate in the same direction and at the same speed as the crowd.
- Skaters who cannot keep up with the crowd should move to the side.
- When playing hockey, only wear a CSA certified helmet. Replace hockey helmets at least every 5 years.
