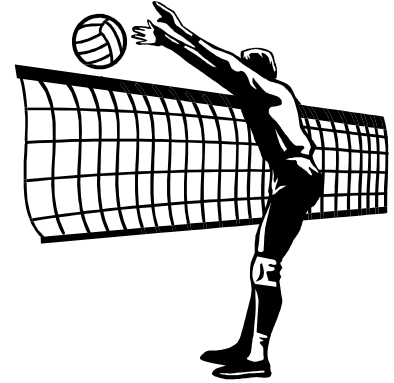

About Assessment and Technology

SEPTEMBER 2011

Welcome back to another exciting school year in Sturgeon School Division. We are in the third year of our school improvement projects (A.I.S.I) and in this month's edition of 'Connecting With Parents' we would like to focus on how schools can communicate more effectively with parents about how their child is progressing, and share a technology tip that relates to how teachers are using new instructional technologies with their students.

Improving Communication between School and Home with the Report Card and Online Portal

Last year we introduced new division report cards for all grades 1 to 12. Teachers and parents were invited to provide feedback on the report cards and we have taken that feedback and made some changes that are intended to communicate better about how your child is progressing.

Our next step (this year) will see some teachers and some schools in the division break down your child's overall grade into how they did in each unit, strand, theme or outcome on the report card. By showing the breakdown parents can see where the child is being successful and where he or she might be struggling with particular content.

In addition, parents can go online and check on their child's progress by going to the Power School Parent Portal (<https://pschool.sturgeon.ab.ca/public/home.html>) and logging in. This will give parents access to detailed information about their child's progress such as grades, attendance, missing assignments, etc. It is a great way to be informed as teachers are updating it every couple of weeks. If you need assistance getting logged in or have questions please contact your school for more information.

21st Century Learning, Technology Integration in the Classroom, and Digital Citizenship

As the school year begins, there is a renewed commitment to use a variety of instructional technologies (Promethean boards, document cameras, projectors, video conferencing, web 2.0 tools, wikis, blogs, online media, etc.) to create a classroom that fosters critical thinking and problem solving, creativity, communication, and collaboration.

To further our focus on the responsible uses of technology, we will be assisting your child in becoming an active digital citizen through the safe use of technology. For additional information and resources regarding the nine elements of digital citizenship please visit:

Paper Recycling @ Camilla School

Thanks to the efforts of Teresa Sheehan we now have a paper recycling program at Camilla School.

Greys Paper Recycling Industries is a company pioneering the concept of closed-loop recycling. Closed-looped means natural resources are used, then recycled, then used again with little or no loss of material volume.

Their vision is to build an eco-friendly closed loop paper recycling facility, the first of its kind in North America, here in Edmonton. The plant will be located at the Edmonton Waste Management Centre.

Greys Paper Recycling Industries Ltd. will be collecting our paper for recycling twice a month. Each class will raise \$4 per month to help pay for the program.



Grade 4 Student Is On A Mission

After attending summer camp this past summer one grade 4 student was inspired to think that she could make a difference and has set out to raise money and awareness for the homeless. “I am trying to raise money for the Hope Mission in Edmonton.” states 9 year old Brooke Bonin.

“We (Brooke and her mom Bridget) went online to try and find an organization in our community but had no success. So she looked up ones in Edmonton and found three different foundations. She solely picked the HOPE FOUNDATION.”

Brooke presented her idea to her classmates to see if they wanted to help and was happy to hear that they had many ideas as to how they could help raise money. With the help of Brooke’s mom, Brooke and some friends plan to organize some craft and bake sales, have a garage sale, and save their recyclable juice boxes, to name a few. Not everyone is as lucky as we are and I want to help them so they can feel lucky too. My foundation is called “The Lucky Foundation” and I would like to try to raise \$1000 by the end of the school year.”

Bridget Bonin remarks. . . “ My daughter’s heart is in the right place and I would like to see her kindness and devotion help her meet her goal. To date she has raised approximately \$100.00. My daughter thinks she is lucky and I know that I am lucky to have a daughter like her! Thank you!”
