PROGRAMS

Our exciting, engaging programs suit every student's ability, interests and goals!

ALBERTA CURRICULUM

Camilla School follows the Alberta Curriculum, which specifies the knowledge and skills that students are expected to learn, set by Alberta Education.

HEADSTART

Headstart is designed for children between the ages of 3½ to 5 who need communication and/or developmental support. Children get a jumpstart on their education, building skills in communication, social development, physical development and emotional development. Screening is required.

KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten students are packed with passion and potential to be anything they want in the world. We work hand-in-hand with parents, offering alternate full day programming, to prepare each learner for the transition from home to school and entry into Grade 1.

ATHLETICS

We offer archery, golf, cross country running, a running club, volleyball, basketball, badminton and track and field. Students in grades 6 to 9 participate in interschool league play. Our school also has an ice skating/hockey arena available for school use.

LEADERSHIP
